#### Forms of Assessment

This will be the same along the different standards.

There will be one test every quarter. It will include only the material covered since the previous test. This test grade will be sixty percent of the marking period grade.

Every Friday there will be a quiz on the material covered that week. The average of these quizzes over the entire marking period will constitute forty percent of the marking period grade.

- List and describe the aids and drawbacks in the spread of Christianity

The student will demonstrate knowledge of the Third century: the century of persecution and the founding of Eastern monasticism.

- Understand monasticism and list important saints playing a leading role in its establishment

## Standard 5

The student will demonstrate knowledge of the Fourth century: the era of Arianism.

- Summarize the tenth persecution
- Describe the life and teachings of Arius
- Understand the differences between Arianism and our Catholic faith
- Explain the Council of Nicaea (325; First Ecumenical Council)

- Describe the lives of Constantine and St. Athanasius
- Describe Donatism (heresy)
- Understand how Arianism spread to the barbarian nations
- List and describe the Greek Fathers (Doctors)
- List and describe the Latin Fathers (doctors)
- Describe the lives of Julian the Apostate and Theodosius

- Explain the spread of monasticism
- Describe the life and accomplishments of Pope St. Gregory the Great
- ♦ Describe conversions in England

## Standard 8

The student will demonstrate knowledge of the Seventh century: Mohammedanism.

- Understand the life and teachings of Mohammed
- Define the religion called Islam
- ♦ Explain the Monothelitism heresy
- Explain the importance of the Irish monks

The student will demonstrate knowledge of the Eighth century: St. Boniface and Charlemagne.

# Standard 10

# Standard 12

The student will demonstrate knowledge of the Eleventh century: Hildebrand, Pope St. Gregory VII; the Greek schism; the First Crusade.

The student will demonstrate knowledge of the Fourteenth century: the Babylonian Captivity and the Great Western Schism.

- Analyze the conflict between Phillip IV the Fair, of France, and the pope
- ◆ Describe the Babylonian Captivity of the popes (1305-77)
- ♦ Understand the Great Western Schism
- List saints of the era

The student will demonstrate knowledge of the Fifteenth century: the Renaissance.

- Explain the fall of Constantinople (1453)
